I am a Tenured Scientist at the Institute of Economic Analysis (IAE-CSIC) and the coordinator of the "Society" Scientific area of the CSIC since April 2023 (and I have been vice-director of the IAE del 01/09/2014 to 15/03/2018). Since December 2012 I am the chair of the BSE Academic Program Committee, which means that I am responsible for the academic coordination of the BSE educational activities, including masters and summer schools. Since January 2022 I am the President of the Scientific Committee of the Barcelona Local Government (and I am member of the committee since January 2019). Since February 2024 I am the President of the Catalan Economic Society (SCE, IEC) and I was member of the board of the society from November 2019 since February 2024. I am also IZA Research fellow since June 2009.

I hold one PhD from the Tinbergen Institute and the University of Amsterdam (“Quantitative analysis of well-being with economic applications”, advisor, Prof. B.M.S. van Praag, January 2023) and a second one from Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute, Troy, NY(US) (“Consumption, behavior, and the environment: Theoretical and empirical dimensions.”, advisor: Prof. J. Gowdy, May 2023).

My main research lies at the intersection of wellbeing and economics, contributing to the analysis of individuals’ wellbeing to understand not only its determinants, but also to understand individuals’ behavior (for example voting) as well as the welfare implications of (public) decisions. I have been working in the field of wellbeing and self-reported satisfaction since 1999, contributing to academic research as well as engaging in policy and dissemination activities. The scientific community has recognized my contributions in the field in several ways. I was awarded with the 2022 ISQOLS Research Fellow Award for substantial contribution to Quality-Of-Life research (International Society for Quality-of-Life Studies, ISQOLS). I have also been appointed the director of the World Well-Being Panel from April 2020 to June 2023 (and I am panelist of it since 2016). My academic papers have been cited, according to Google Scholar 14309 times (h-Index=32 and i10 index = 45) (28 January 2025) and I have 20 articles that are cited more than 100 times, of which 4 are cited more than 1,000 times (3744, 2614, 1559, and 1520 times). My second most cited article (2614) is single-authored paper published in the Journal of Public Economics. My book Happiness Quantified (Oxford University Press, 2004) co-authored with Benard Van Praag has been a reference book for the field. Similarly, I have been asked to contribute to honorary books (in honor of Richard Easterlin, Springer Nature) or Encyclopedias (Encyclopedia of Quality of Life Research, Springer; Encyclopedia of Happiness, Quality of Life and Subjective Wellbeing, Edward Elgar; Research Handbook on Measuring Poverty and Deprivation, Edward Elgar; Handbook of Labor, Human Resources and Population Economics, Springer; Oxford Handbook of Economic Inequality, Oxford University Press).

My work has also been recognized by the general public, with several interviews in written, radio and television. In addition, and to engage with the public, I have published in blogs and general audience magazines and I have participated in debates and round tables for a general audience, including university students and secondary school teachers.

Within the framework of my research, I have also advised policy makers, including international organizations. The most recent policy advisory work was with Catalan Government: Office of Foresight

and Strategy (Sep. 2021- Jan. 2024) to develop a questionnaire as well as set of indicators to measure welfare in Catalonia. I have also advised international organizations (World Bank) and public entities.

I have contributed to organize several conferences and workshop by being part of the organizing and scientific committee. I have teaching experience at the graduate level and I supervise several Master Projects every year.

My research has always been financed by the relevant Spanish and Catalan ministries, but I have also participated in competitive projects financed by international organizations or private foundations. In addition, I have obtained non-competitive projects in the form of policy advice, both public and private.
